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

The Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of New York is separately incorporated according to the not for profit laws of New York State with its own active Board of Trustees.



The Audit Committee oversees an independent public accounting firm that conducts an annual audit of Catholic Charities finances. Funds received by Catholic Charities are carefully monitored to ensure their use complies with donor intent and grant and contractual requirements. Funds are maintained in separate accounts and not co-mingled with those of the Archdiocese of New York
