Dear Friends and Colleagues,

I write to you as I reflect on my 25+ years at Catholic Charities and the moments that have touched me deeply. I include among the many great joys of my time the opportunity to work with so many who care and contribute to making New York better and improving our neighbors' lives. These enriched me beyond what I could have ever imagined or hoped for. I am grateful.

Some of you will recall that it was immediately after the 9/11 terrorist attacks that I became Executive Director. In one of New York's darkest moments, I learned important lessons that have guided me since: despite New York's strengths, we are still vulnerable; Catholic Charities is essential to crisis response; and we have a unique responsibility to partner, lead, and convene diverse groups to meet critical needs. Catholic Charities' impact has been evidenced time and again – when Superstorm Sandy struck, when migrant families surged into New York, and when COVID shuttered most of the city – but not Catholic Charities.

I pay tribute to Cardinal Egan for attracting talented lay leadership, and to the Trustees, especially four extraordinary Chairs whose support has been vital. I am particularly grateful for his support of our federation of agencies.

I raise up those Catholic Charities staff out on the streets, in residences, community centers, food pantries, schools, and apartments. They are the face and hands of Catholic Charities.

I appreciate the support so many have shown for 25+ years. I have been blessed "to show up" for our poorest and most vulnerable neighbors. I am grateful for the honor and blessing of serving as Executive Director.



Feeding Our Neighbors: Serving 10+ Million Meals



Hunger strikes at the very heart of human dignity. In New York, over a million people – including one in four children – struggle with food insecurity. Rising prices mean more families than ever are turning to Catholic Charities for nourishment and hope.

Feeding Our Neighbors

Through our vast network of food pantries, community soup kitchens, mobile pantries, meal delivery services, and distribution hub in the Bronx, Catholic Charities provides nutritious, life-sustaining food to more than 50,000 New Yorkers every month.

Providing Critical Food Support

No one should have to choose between rent and food. Our food programs ensure that families and individuals who cannot afford groceries receive vital support. We provide three-toseven-day supplies of food based on family size, including fresh produce, meat, poultry, and non-perishables.

Our community soup kitchens offer hot, nutritious meals - served with dignity, care, and compassion. We deliver meals to the homebound, especially senior citizens, ensuring they have reliable access to nutritious food in the comfort of their own homes.

In times of urgent need, Catholic Charities responds swiftly with emergency food distributions. We deploy food trucks directly into affected communities, delivering fresh and shelf-stable food to individuals and families in crisis. Boxes and bags of groceries are distributed to those in need, offering immediate relief and helping them navigate challenging times with essential support.

POTS: More Than a Meal, A Pathway to Stability and Dignity

Part of the Solution (POTS), a longtime Catholic Charities agency in the Bronx, offers far more than meals – it provides a pathway to stability and dignity for New Yorkers in crisis. Each month, hundreds of neighbors visit POTS for nourishing food through its pantry and community dining room, where guests can find comfort, compassion, and a warm meal shared among friends.

Beyond food, POTS delivers wrap-around services that help individuals rebuild their lives – from showers and haircuts to job training, resume assistance, and career coaching. Orlando, a client who found POTS after losing his mother and experiencing homelessness, shared, "I'm grateful for the support I received from Catholic Charities. Catholic Charities allows everyone to come and treats everyone the same." POTS staff member Taina Rodriguez added, "We see people who are street homeless. It is very vital that someone who is struggling has a place where they can go and feel human."



Sheltering the Homeless 16,000+ Individuals Helped

When we think of New York City's unhoused population, we often overlook a significant group: families with children. Over the past decade, the number of homeless families in shelters has doubled. Today, families make up the majority – approximately 75% – of the city's shelter population, with children being the most vulnerable among them.

A Legacy of Affordable Housing: **Providing Stability for Those in Need**

For over 50 years, Catholic Charities has been committed to developing, maintaining, and enhancing affordable housing for low-income individuals and families – including those who are formerly homeless, individuals living with mental illness, refugees, and seniors. Our mission is to offer comprehensive, on-site support services that empower these individuals to thrive and break the cycle of homelessness.

Last year, we opened St. Philip Neri, an affordable housing community in the Bedford Park neighborhood of the Bronx. The building provides 186 new units of supportive housing for New Yorkers in need, offering a safe and stable environment for families.

A New Beginning at St. Philip Neri

As part of our comprehensive housing support services, Catholic Charities offers safe, stable, and welcoming residences specifically designed to help homeless mothers and their children rebuild their lives with dignity and stability.

"I was inside a family shelter," said Zipporah. "I didn't feel safe. It wasn't easy." Before entering the shelter system, Zipporah and her children faced homelessness, moving from house to house, staying with various friends.

Families make up the majority of New York City's homeless population, and about 30% of families in the shelter system include a working adult. Catholic Charities works closely with these families while they reside in shelters to help overcome barriers to housing and prevent a return to homelessness.

After spending nine months in the shelter system, Zipporah, along with her seven-year-old son and newborn daughter, gratefully moved into their new apartment at St. Philip Neri. The building, designed to offer both stability and support, was the perfect place for Zipporah and her children to begin their promising new chapter. "Catholic Charities has provided me with a place that I can call home," said Zipporah. "I feel safe. It's very clean. The staff is very nice. They actually care about you."

Every family deserves a safe, stable roof over their head. This lifesaving work - helping unhoused neighbors like Zipporah and her children find hope, security, and a place to call home – is only possible because of the unwavering support of our generous donors and committed supporters.





Caring for Children and Youth 99,000+ Youth Provided Care

All children deserve the opportunity to learn social skills, gain confidence, and develop lasting values. Through our dropout prevention and after-school programs, along with our preventive services and foster care initiatives, we are committed to supporting the physical, emotional, and psychological well-being of children and their families.

Life-changing Arts Work Experience in Hamilton Heights through SYEP

The Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP) offers young people between the ages of 14 and 24 the opportunity to gain valuable work experience, develop professional skills, and earn money. Aimed at low-income youth across the city, the program helps participants explore career paths while building confidence, leadership, and social skills. In 2024, Catholic Charities enrolled 1,887 participants in over 240 worksites, providing life-changing opportunities.

Ana, a 16-year-old high school student from the Bronx, took part in the program and worked with a team to create a mural at P.S. 368 in Hamilton Heights. "I'm very interested in art," said Ana. "I'm passionate about painting, creating, and expressing myself through color and design."

Her experience was about more than just art. "This is my first time having a job," she said. "It was great having the money, seeing it, and being able to use it. I feel grown a little bit. I feel like I'm getting older. It's nice to feel grown."

Ana also gained confidence in her communication skills. "I've never been good at talking in a group of people. I've never really been the person to talk," she shared. "But now, I get to talk. I've learned new ways to express myself." Ana's experience is a testament to the impact of SYEP, empowering youth to develop skills and confidence for the future.

Empowering Young People at Alianza Dominicana Cultural Center

Music plays a leading role in the youth programming at Catholic Charities' Alianza Dominicana Cultural Center, located in Washington Heights, known as "Little Dominican Republic." The center showcases Dominican and Latin American arts, offering free workshops in computers, dance, Afro-Latin percussion, and more. Weekends bring students to accordion lessons, where they learn to play the fast-paced, joyful music of the Merengue genre.

"I love the center – being able to practice art, music, and dance. Hove it! It's really good," said Elyssia, an 11-year-old. "When I start learning new things here, I'm excited about my schoolwork and to learn more."

"Our programming helps children excel in school, improve attendance and grades, and feel proud of their community," said Leonardo Ivan Dominguez, Cultural Program Director. For Mr. Dominguez, instilling respect for their culture empowers young people to thrive and grow into confident, educated individuals.



Welcoming Immigrants and Refugees 108,000+ People Served

We are committed to welcoming the stranger and recognizing the inherent dignity of every person. New York City, a place built by the hands and dreams of immigrants from all corners of the world, stands as a testament to the strength and resilience of those who seek a better life. As we accompany immigrants and refugees on their journey of rebuilding, we embrace the diversity that makes our city - and our mission - so rich and meaningful.

Empowering Newcomers for Success

Catholic Charities' Immigrant and Refugee Services Division offers a lifeline for newcomers - providing help with immigration legal services, housing support, employment, language training, citizenship classes, access to benefits, and more. This holistic approach ensures that families not only survive, but thrive.

The International Center is a key component of this support system - providing vital resources to help immigrants and refugees integrate into their new community. The International Center creates a supportive learning environment where individuals can gain the skills and confidence needed to flourish in New York.

Helping Ukrainian Refugees Rebuild their Lives in New York

Olha, a certified nursing assistant, is a busy mom in the Bronx who balances work, cooking, and caring for her two sons with studying English for up to five hours daily. "After work, I go to English classes, but it's difficult to be honest. I need to improve my English just a little more," she said.

Olha is one of over 6.5 million refugees who fled Russia's invasion of Ukraine, with more than 500,000 arriving in the United States. New York leads in welcoming these refugees, and Catholic Charities has supported over 4,000 Ukrainians, including Olha and her sons.

"Catholic Charities helped me a lot. They gave me money to support myself when I first came here," said Olha. "They helped me to find a job." Thanks to the support she received, Olha trained as a certified nursing assistant and is now able to support her family.

Olha's resilience is evident in her dedication to her children's future. "If they work hard, my sons will go to college," she said, explaining how she is helping them navigate this new life. "We are very happy to be here," Olha added, grateful for the opportunity to rebuild their lives.

Olha is committed to her new path in life, pursuing further education to achieve her dream of becoming a registered nurse. She is determined to succeed. "It takes time, but you have a chance," she said, imparting the same hope to her sons.

Catholic Charities plays a vital role in the resettlement process, offering a lifeline to those seeking refuge. For Olha and many other refugees, it's not just about finding a new place to live. It's about creating new opportunities and rebuilding a sense of hope for the future.





We believe that resilient families are the foundation of vibrant communities. We offer essential guidance, referrals, and direct assistance to families facing crisis, covering areas such as child welfare, maternity support, family counseling, and financial aid. None of this would be possible without the generosity of our compassionate donors and supporters.

Newburgh Ministry: A Journey of Hope

Gaye is living a life of stability and purpose in her cozy apartment, just steps away from her parttime job at Newburgh Ministry. It's a life she cherishes after years of challenges. "Every day, I thank God for this opportunity," said Gaye. "It's a blessing to finally have a place to call home."

Gaye's apartment is part of an affordable housing community in Newburgh, made possible through the support of Catholic Charities' Newburgh Ministry. After years of hard work, setbacks, and resilience, Gaye now has a safe, secure place to live and a job that allows her to help others.

Born and raised on Long Island, Gaye built a life working in retail. She spent years as a dedicated employee at 1-800-FLOWERS before the 2008 financial crisis caused her to lose her job. From there, her life took a difficult turn. "I lost my apartment after my mother and sister passed away back to back," she explained. "I had to separate from my son so he could finish school with his classmates."

Gaye eventually found herself at the Newburgh Ministry shelter during the COVID-19 pandemic. She quickly found a welcoming and supportive community. "The staff welcomed me with open arms. They made me feel very comfortable during one of the hardest times of my life," shared Gaye.



Gaye's determination to rebuild her life never wavered. She applied for countless housing opportunities, documented her progress in a notebook, and kept pushing forward despite numerous setbacks. Her perseverance paid off when she was approved for an apartment.

"When I walked into my new apartment, I couldn't believe it. I kept pinching myself. It was everything I had prayed for," she said.

Gaye also found purpose in her role at Newburgh Ministry. Initially volunteering by folding towels and helping in the kitchen, she was later offered a part-time position. For Gaye, her journey is a testament to resilience and faith.

She credits Catholic Charities for providing her with the crucial support and resources she needed to get back on her feet and rebuild her life. "Catholic Charities has always been there for me," Gaye said. "They've been a real blessing."

Empowering People with Disabilities 4,800+ People Assisted

Disabilities come in many forms – both visible and invisible. We offer a network of specialized disability support services to help seniors adjusting to blindness, developmentally disabled children, teens and adults dealing with alcohol and substance abuse, and those with behavioral and emotional challenges.

Kennedy Children's Center: Empowering Children Through Early Special Education

Catholic Charities provides critical support to at-risk children and families, addressing their physical, emotional, and psychological needs. One of the key agencies in our network, Kennedy Children's Center (KCC), has been empowering children with special needs for over six decades.

Since 1958, KCC has been a lifeline for children with significant challenges, helping them develop the skills they need to succeed. What began as a small program has grown into an essential service for approximately 400 preschool students each day. These children, referred by the New York City Department of Education's Committee on Preschool Special Education, often face a range of physical, cognitive, and emotional challenges that hinder their ability to thrive in traditional educational settings.

KCC's curriculum focuses on purposeful play, social-emotional development, and sensory engagement. This approach not only promotes learning but also encourages meaningful interactions among children, teachers, and their peers. The goal is to create an environment where children feel supported, valued, and capable of overcoming obstacles. KCC is shaping a future where these children will be more prepared to navigate life's challenges.



Zanaida, a mother whose son Justin is enrolled at KCC, shared a powerful story of transformation. "My child was non-verbal, not walking. Now he's walking. He talks! Sometimes I'm still amazed when he talks to me. I think, 'Is it him? Is it really Justin?'" she shared.

Zanaida had been told that her son would never be able to walk or talk. However, after just one year at KCC, Justin made remarkable progress. He learned to walk independently, chew, and eat solid foods. This transformation speaks to the dedication and skill of KCC's highly trained staff, who tailor their approach to meet each child's unique needs.

In New York City, more than 1,200 children between the ages of 3 and 5 are currently waiting for enrollment in a special education program like KCC's. These children, much like Justin, are ready to unlock their potential with the right care and support.
